PROGRAM:

Arrival: 9th August 2025 at Karmøy Airport

Departure: 18th August from Karmøy Airport

Participants: 12 boys and girls, maximum two from each country

Age: 18-20 years

Accommodation: In hostels, B&B's, private homes or cottages.

Language: English

Costs: EUR 300 + pocket money and travel expenses to and from Norway

Clothing: Summer clothes, including swimsuit, warm clothes, wind jacket and good hiking shoes.

Food: Traditional Norwegian food. Please inform us if you have any food restrictions.

Insurance: Participants must be insured against illness, accidents and third-party liabilities according to Rotary International recommendations.

Acceptance: Applications will be considered in order of being received. Still the gender balance will be in focus.

We start this day with a car trip to the southern tip of Karmøy, to idyllic Skudeneshavn. Here you can stroll around the old town and enjoy the tranquility among well-preserved small wooden houses built in the 19th century in the Empire style.

At Skudeneshavn's local butcher, the tradition is to taste freshly fried sweet pancakes with salty bacon when we visit Skudeneshavn.

If we are lucky with the weather this day, we will quickly go on to Åkrehamn and enjoy the summer day at Åkrasanden. The beach has been voted Norway's finest, with white sandy beaches as far as the eye can see, so remember to pack your swim suit this day.



But with the North Sea as our nearest neighbour - never a dull moment - so the weather might as well bring us rain and cool temperatures even if it is summer. Then we would rather fill the program for the rest of the day with activities that may suit better; perhaps it would rather be a storm safari with fresh waves and sea spray on the beaches than swimming and barbecueing?

The strong Salhus current meant that vessels often had to lie down and wait for the current to turn.

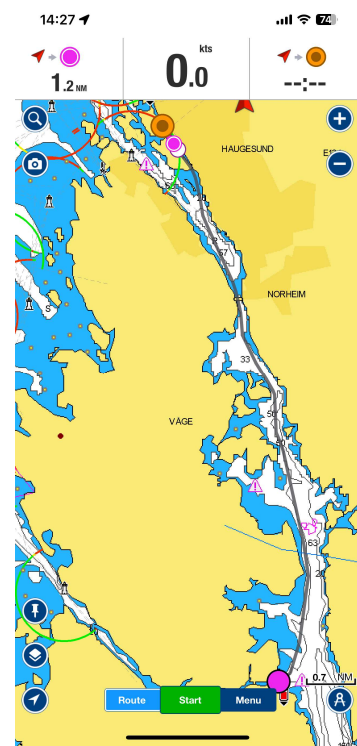
Avaldsneset itself is higher situated and is easy to protect against enemies.

- 21.00 a walk in Haugesund before return to hotell



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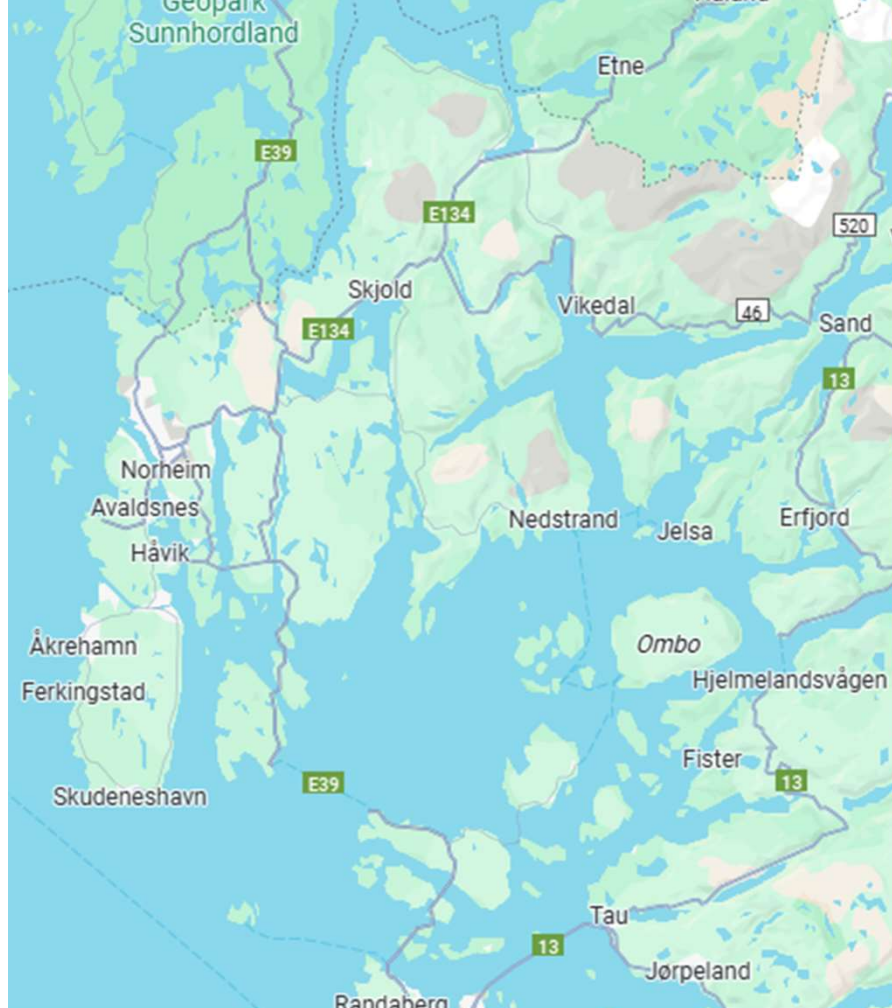


Karmøy Rotary Club Sunday, August 17th
